

THE SHAG—Phalacrocorax aristotelis aristotelis (L.)

A scarce visitor to the coast of Lakeland, appearing inland

only when storm-driven.

Two out of five immature Shags found inland occurred in North Cumberland, one at Crosby-on-Eden on 1 January 1908 (Trans. Carlisle Nat. Hist. Soc., Vol. 3, p. 15), the other in the Beweastle district on 28 October 1935. One was captured on Ullswater on 27 July 1928, and another in June 1933.

On the evening of 19 December 1942, and during a spell of rough weather, F. Lambert shot an immature Shag as it was flighting down the River Sark to the open Solway. This bird, flighting down the River Sark to the open Solway. as evidenced by the prey it contained, had spent the day fishing up the river, an unusual departure.

A bird shot on Windermere, Westmorland, on 1 December 1927, had been ringed as a nestling in Sutherland on 6 July that year (British Birds, Vol. 21, p. 296).

Introduction

This report is a compilation of material published between 1900 and 1949 inclusive on the ornithology of Cumbria. It has been drawn up partly on the basis of four previous bibliographies, those by Mullens et al (1920), Shackleton (2010), and Armsby (2015), together with additional material identified during the preparation of this document. As in Part A (Sellers et al 2017) the intention has been to cite full bibliographic details for each publication identified, though some details are wanting in a number of instances (indicated by a question mark in square brackets). Every effort has been made to check spellings and any apparent errors ('Westmoreland' for 'Westmorland', for instance) are as in the original. Punctuation in article titles has been reproduced as in the original. Journals vary as to their use of upper case or capitals in the titles of articles, so, for consistency, we have only capitalised the initial word in the title, proper names and bird names. Similarly we have only used italics for scientific names, and regardless of whether italics were used in the original.

Many of the newspaper articles have one or more by-lines or secondary titles. To differentiate between

these, a dash has been introduced between the main title (which appears first) and the subsidiary title. Thus the title of the article shown in Figure 1 becomes "A unique case of birds - Interesting exhibit at Tullie House". Some of the later newspaper articles, especially those published under the pseudonym 'Onlooker' and entitled 'Incidental Notes' cover a variety of subjects (that is, not just natural history) and appear to have been penned by a variety of authors. Those included here are believed to be all or nearly all by Ritson Graham. Only those dealing with ornithology are listed here (a more detailed summary of Ritson Graham's publications is in preparation and will include all his natural history publications, not just those about birds, and will summarise the evidence that he was, indeed, the author).

Where appropriate additional information is given in square brackets following the bibliographic citation. In particular they indicate which bird species are mentioned in the text (if not stated in the title) or where copies of material not in serial publications such as journals can be obtained, either in hard copy or in electronic form. Details of the availability of serials are

given in Appendix 3.

Entries have been arranged so that using the search facility in Adobe Acrobat (control F) should allow all relevant entries to be identified. Note, however, that it is essential to use the modern English names commonly used by ornithologists in Britain as listed in the British List (British Ornithologists Union, (2020). Thus searching for publications dealing with the Dunnock, say, it is necessary to enter 'Dunnock' and not older versions of the name such as 'Hedge Sparrow'; similarly 'Willow Tit' will locate all publications mentioning this species, but 'Willow-Tit', as the species name was often written in the past, will not. Conversely, where the modern commonly used name shown in the British List is hyphenated, for instance, in species such as the Nightheron and Honey-buzzard, only the hyphenated form should be used. Furthermore, the IOC International English Names (which are also included in the British List) should not be used, thus it is essential to use 'Red Grouse' and not the IOC name, 'Willow Ptarmigan'. Similarly singulars should be used, thus 'Greylag Goose' not 'Greylag Geese'.

No attempt has been made here to distinguish between high quality publications and more run of the mill material, although it is clear that the quality varies considerably. Nor can we vouch for the validity of the information that appears in the publications cited; more was taken on trust in the past than it is today, and undoubtedly some incorrect information will be contained within some of the publications included – let the user beware!

Whilst a great deal of effort has been put into identifying the items shown, it is almost inevitable in a work of this nature that some material has been overlooked, or that errors in the bibliographic details have crept in. We are acutely aware, for instance, that no systematic survey of the county's newspapers, often an important forum for the publication of material on natural history in the first half of the 20th century, has been undertaken, and it would not be surprising if some articles from this source remained to be found. The authors would be pleased to hear of any new material (no matter how brief or trivial it may seem), of any corrections that need to be made, or of suggestions for improvement.

Ornithology in Cumbria, 1900-1949

By the close of the 19th century ornithology in Cumbria had been put on a firm footing, largely through the efforts of H.A.Macpherson, culminating in his A Vertebrate Fauna of Lakeland, published in 1892. The first half of the 20th century was largely a period of consolidating the almost exclusively descriptive (as opposed to quantitative) approach adopted in the previous century. A major development in ornithology in the period under consideration here, was the introduction of bird-ringing, a technique that was embraced enthusiastically by a number of local ringers, but, with one or two notable exceptions, it was not until the second half of the century that detailed analysis of the recoveries generated began to be undertaken. More generally the period 1900-1949 was one of filling in the gaps in our knowledge of the occurrence of species in Cumbria, their abundance and distribution in the county and their natural history.
